Androgen-related disorders are present in six to eight percent of women of reproductive age, affecting 3.7 to 4.9 million women in the U.S. and 89 to 119 million worldwide. Approximately 70 to 90 percent of androgen excess involves polycystic ovary syndrome (PCOS). This conference will bring together clinicians and researchers who will present the latest and most relevant information on the diagnosis, treatment and care of women with androgen excess, diabetes mellitus and insulin resistance, hirsutism, infertility, oligomenorrhea, PCOS and other diseases related to androgen imbalances in women.

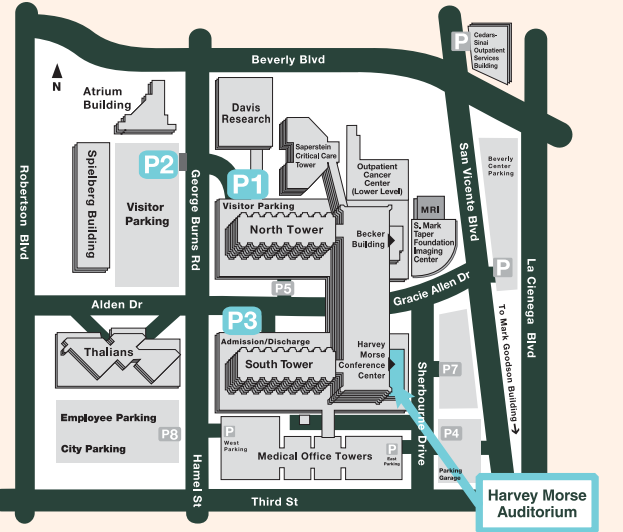
